Description:

Aligarh is an Industrial and Educational hub famous for its Lock Industries and Aligarh Muslim University (AMU). It provides employment to the people from all the states of India. It's a melting pot so far as people from various states, cultures, traditions and languages are living together.

The Campus is located at Anoopshahar Road, Kasimpur Tiraha, Chherat, 8 km away from Railway Station and 5 km from Jamalpur Railway Bridge.

The Anoopshahar Road is connected with the highway of Delhi through a by-pass road. The campus is built on a plot of 12 acres of land. It is accessible by local and intercity regular bus services. The college buses and vans are also available for transportation.

History:

In 1998, Dr. Manzoor Ahmad, Ex-Vice-Chancellor, Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra visited AMU. On this occasion he reminded the mission of Sir Syed Ahmad Khan that asked the audience to develop higher education institutions in India. On his motivation and encouragement, the council of Trustees of Charitable Trust resolved to start a College at Aligarh.

In the 2008-2009 session, B.Ed course was introduced in Aligarh College of Education with the intake of 100 students. The Aligarh College of Education started some new courses such as BA (2014 onwards) with seven subjects, B.Com (2014 onwards), B.Sc. ZBC & PCM (2015 onwards) and B.Sc. (Biotechnology) from 2015 onwards.
